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### Procrastination

Introduction: We have recently studied about sacrifice, dedication, and what it takes to give God our very best. What happens when we DON'T give God our best? What gets in our way? If we don't figure that out, or we live in denial, our Christian walk can become toxic! We can cripple our own spirituality along with those around us. We need to recognize these enemies that will lead us down the road to TOXIC CHRISTIAN LIVING. Let's start our study together...

Are you ready to defeat these enemies? Then take action immediately. Do you believe in Jesus? Then follow Him daily. Do you believe in the Bible? Then obey what it says. Why are you waiting? Don't procrastinate! It's time to give God what He deserves... your very best!

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Fear

Introduction: We have begun a series on TOXIC CHRISTIAN LIVING. We seek to recognize the things that happen when we DON'T give God our best. What gets in our way? How do these things hinder our Christian walk to the point it becomes toxic? How can we cripple our own spirituality along with those around us? We need to recognize these enemies and defeat them. Today we will talk about fear. There's nothing wrong with having a healthy fear (reverence) of God, but God has not given us the spirit of fear (**II Timothy 1:7, Romans 8:28-39**). What is toxic about fear? Let's study together...

- A. Fear can take away your confidence (Matthew 6:19-34, Hebrews 13:5-6).
- B. Fear can take away your perspective (I John 4:4, Luke 22:31).
- C. Fear can take away your reality (Matthew 22:29, Psalm 23:4).
- D. Fear can take away your spirituality (Matthew 10:16-42, Lamentations 3:57).
- E. Fear can take away your understanding (I Corinthians 10:13, Hebrews 4:15).

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### Covetousness

<u>Introduction</u>: We are studying a series on TOXIC CHRISTIAN LIVING. We seek to recognize the things that happen when we DON'T give God our best. What gets in our way? What things can cripple our own spirituality along with those around us. We need to recognize these enemies and defeat them before they become toxic. Today I want us to talk about covetousness. Consider some great Bible teachings on this subject (**Matthew 6:21-24**, **I Corinthians 4:1-5**). Let's study together...

- B. Covetousness leads to deficiency (Proverbs 11:28).
- C. Covetousness leads to destruction (Proverbs 15:7).

- E. Covetousness leads to denial (Proverbs 30:8-9).

### II. Biblical Examples

<u>Conclusion</u>: We do not know the hour of our eternal departure and we are not promised tomorrow. Therefore, before we die we need to put to death some things in our lives (**Colossians 3:5-6**). Toxic Christian living consists of a hypocritical walk. Are you ready to defeat these enemies? Then take action immediately. Do you believe in Jesus? Are you following Him daily? Do you believe in the Bible? Are you obeying what the Bible tells you? Why are you waiting to make things right? Don't let covetousness overcome you! It's time to give God what He deserves... our very best!

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Greed

<u>Introduction</u>: We are studying a series on TOXIC CHRISTIAN LIVING. We seek to recognize the things that happen when we DON'T give God our best. What gets in our way? What things can cripple our own spirituality along with those around us. We need to recognize these enemies and defeat them before they become toxic. Earlier we talked about covetousness, but we also have to consider some close relatives: greed and envy. I would like for us to start by recognizing one of Jesus's teachings on greed (**Luke 12:15**). Why should we avoid greed? Let's study together...

- B. Greed leads to division (Proverbs 15:27).
- C. Greed leads to desire (Proverbs 23:1-6).

Why are you waiting to make things right? Don't let greed get in your way! It's time to give God what He deserves... our very best!

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Envy

<u>Introduction</u>: We are studying a series on TOXIC CHRISTIAN LIVING. We seek to recognize the things that happen when we DON'T give God our best. What gets in our way? Thus far we have considered covetousness and greed, but what about envy? How are they any different? Consider what Paul says in **I Corinthians 3:1-4**. Why should we avoid envy? Let's study together...

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### Selfishness

It's time to give God your very best!

David said: "*Though the Lord is supreme, He takes care of those who are humble, but He stays away from the proud*" (**Psalm 138:6**). Have you ever wondered why God resists the proud? Let's study together...

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Lust

Introduction: We are studying a series on TOXIC CHRISTIAN LIVING. We seek to recognize the things that happen when we DON'T give God our best. What gets in our way? What things can cripple our own spirituality along with those around us? We need to recognize these enemies and defeat them before they become toxic. In this lesson we will talk about the dangers of lust. Lust is defined as an intense desire, appetite, covetousness or eagerness. Why should we avoid lust? Let's study together...

- B. Lust can extinguish you (**Proverbs 6:30-35**).
- C. Lust can enable you (Proverbs 7:1-9).
- D. Lust can embarrass you (Proverbs 7:10-20).
- E. Lust can entrap you (**Proverbs 7:21-23**).

### II. Biblical Examples

- A. Potiphar's Wife (**Genesis 39:6-13**) \* What can we learn from her example?
- B. Samson (Judges 13-16) \* What can we learn from Samson's example?

Are you ready to defeat these enemies? Then take action immediately. Do you believe in Jesus? Are you following Him daily? Do you believe in the Bible? Are you obeying what the Bible tells you? Why are you waiting to make things right? Why do we allow lust to consume us? Let's learn self-control. It's time to give God what He deserves... our very best!

- A. Anger is a real problem (Matthew 5:21-23).
- B. Anger leads to reproach (Matthew 7:1-6).
- C. Anger can start with a righteous cause (Mark 3:5).
- D. Anger can be reckless (Ephesians 4:26-27).
- E. Anger must be resolved (Hebrews 10:30).

#### II. Biblical Examples

- A. Cain (Genesis 4:5-6, I John 3:12) \* What can we learn from Cain's example?
- B. Esau (Genesis 27:45) \* What can we learn from Esau's example?

Toxic Christian living consists of a hypocritical walk. Are you ready to defeat these enemies? Then take action immediately. Do you believe in Jesus? Are you following Him daily? Do you believe in the Bible? Are you obeying what the Bible tells you? Learn to control your anger. Look to Jesus! It's time to give God what He deserves... our very best!

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Hypocrisy

Introduction: We are studying a series on TOXIC CHRISTIAN LIVING. We need to recognize things that happen when we DON'T give God our best. What gets in our way? What cripples our own spirituality? We need to recognize these enemies and defeat them before they become toxic. We have considered procrastination, fear, covetousness, greed, envy, laziness, selfishness, materialism, pride, lust, and anger. Today we will emphasize the dangers of hypocrisy. Let's study together...

- A. Hypocrites are inconsistent (Matthew 23:1-3).
- B. Hypocrites are inconsiderate (Matthew 23:4).
- C. Hypocrites are insincere (**Matthew 23:5-7**).
- D. Hypocrites are invalid (**Matthew 23:8-10**).
- E. Hypocrites are insolent (**Matthew 23:11-12**).
