

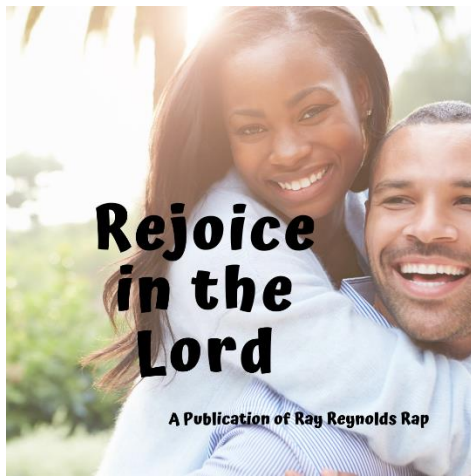

Is faith your default? Or is it fear? In this particular lesson we will focus on the joy of belief. There is only ONE faith (our belief system). Let’s study together...

Introduction: We are studying a series of lessons on the subject of joy. We know that Jesus commanded His disciples to be joyful. **John 15:11** says, “*These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full.*” We need Christian soldiers that are not afraid to stand up for what they know is right. The Bible has many good characters that exemplify a life of courage. Let’s study about them together...

Discussion:

I. We Need Courage Like Abraham

He left his hometown and his family (**Genesis 12**).
He saved the household of Lot (**Genesis 18**).
He was willing to sacrifice his precious son (**Genesis 22**).

II. We Need Courage Like Micaiah

He was hated by Ahab (**I Kings 22:8**).
He mocked king Ahab (**I Kings 22:15**).
He rebuked the king (**I Kings 22:17**).

III. We Need Courage Like Esther

She listened to Mordecai (**Esther 4**).
She went before the king (**Esther 5**).
She stood up to Haman (**Esther 7**).

IV. We Need Courage Like Jesus

He stood toe to toe with the devil (**Matthew 4**).
He rebuked the Pharisees & Sadducees (**Matthew 23**).
He defeated death (**I Corinthians 15**).

Conclusion: Cowardice robs Christians of joy. Sometimes you have to take risks for the truth. Joy will come when we find ourselves more committed to God and the cause of Christ. Each child of God should drink from the well of joy! Will you be afraid?



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LESSON #4

“The Joy of Dependence”

Text: Romans 8:31-39

Introduction: We are studying a series of lessons on the subject of joy. We know that Jesus commanded His disciples to be joyful. **John 15:11** says, “*These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full.*” What makes independence and freedom desirable? God really wants us to learn how to be more dependent, not independent. Do you depend on Him? Let’s study together...

Discussion:

I. God Is Competent

Moses knew God could fight battles (**Exodus 14:13-14**).
Nehemiah knew God could fight battles (**Nehemiah 4:20**).
Jesus knew God could fight battles (**John 12:50**).
Peter knew God could fight battles (**Acts 12:5-7**).
Paul knew God could fight battles (**Acts 18:14-15**).

II. God Is Confident

He tells us to have faith (**Psalms 5:11**).
He tells us to be prepared (**Ephesians 5:15**).
He tells us to take action (**Ephesians 6:11**).
He tells us to face our enemy (**I Corinthians 16:13**).
He tells us to forget our problems (**Philippians 4:6-7**).

III. God Is Consistent

The Lord provides success (**Hebrews 11**).
The Lord provides salvation (**Psalms 9:13-14**).
The Lord provides stability (**Matthew 28:20**).
The Lord provides security (**Hebrews 13:5**).
The Lord provides strength (**Romans 8:31**).

Conclusion: Don’t ever give up on God. We need to learn to trust in Him. He knows what’s best. Let’s become less independent and more dependent! Give God control of your life!



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LESSON #5

“The Joy of Discipline”

Text: Hebrews 12:5-6

Introduction: We are studying a series of lessons on the subject of joy. We know that Jesus commanded His disciples to be joyful. **John 15:11** says, “*These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full.*” But what happens when we face the wrath of God? What happens when we make mistakes? Christians should improve when God disciplines us. How does He discipline us? What can we learn? Let’s study together....

Introduction: Jesus commanded His disciples to be joyful. **John 15:11** says, “These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full.” One of the greatest privileges a Christian has is to be surrounded by a supportive and encouraging church family. Encouragement is part of our ministry! In today’s lesson we are going to see who needs encouragement and what we can do to make sure they receive it. Let’s study together....

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LESSON #8

“The Joy of Fatherhood”

Text: Luke 15:11-32

Introduction: We are studying a series of lessons on the subject of joy. We know that Jesus commanded His disciples to be joyful. **John 15:11** says, “*These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full.*” The Bible is filled with stories about fathers and their children. God knows that we need spiritual leaders in the home today. What do we know about Christian fathers? Let’s study together...

Discussion:

- I. A Good Father Allows His Children To Choose (vs.11-19)*
 - He understands the desires of his children (vs.12-13).
 - He understands the disappointment of his children (vs.14-16).
 - He understands the discouragement of his children (vs.17-19).
- II. A Good Father Awaits Change In His Children (vs.20-21)*
 - He knows that his children will experience reality (v.17).
 - He knows that his children will experience remorse (v.19).
 - He knows that his children will experience regret (v.20-21).
- III. A Good Father Approves of Conformity In His Children (vs.22-24)*
 - He realizes that his children need a second chance (v.22).
 - He realizes that his children need a season of celebration (v.23).
 - He realizes that his children need a spirit of contentment (v.24).
- IV. A Good Father Accepts The Criticism of His Children (vs.24-32)*
 - He does not condone the actions of the younger brother (vs.24-27).
 - He does not compliment the anger of the older brother (vs.28-31).
 - He notices a contrast in the aspirations between the brothers (v.32).

Conclusion: We need to praise God for our Christian fathers! I hope we can learn to be more like our Heavenly Father. His spirit of love and mercy in this story exemplifies the character of a good father. Do you love your Father? Have you told Him today?



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LESSON #9

“The Joy of Fellowship”

Text: Acts 2:41-47

Introduction: We are studying a series of lessons on the subject of joy. We know that Jesus commanded His disciples to be joyful. **John 15:11** says, “*These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full.*” One of the ways we gain joy is by having fellowship with one another. It would be wise for us to consider what it means to have true fellowship with God and one another. Let’s study together...

Discussion:

I. The Meaning of Fellowship

We Need Christ (**John 17**)

We Need Communion (**I Corinthians 10:16**)

We Need Community (**II Corinthians 6:14**)

We Need Contribution (**II John 10-11**)

II. The Misconceptions of Fellowship

You Can Hide From Darkness (**Ephesians 5:11**)

You Cannot Have Peace (**III John 9-12**)

III. The Mentality of Fellowship

Work For One Another (**I Peter 4:9**)

Love One Another (**I John 2:11**)

Conclusion: Each child of God should drink from the well of joy! One way to achieve that joy is through fellowship. Our fellowship depends on our relationship to God (**I John 1:5-10**). Are you in fellowship with God? Are you in fellowship with His saints? Give the Lord control of your life! Seek His fellowship and the fellowship of His church!



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LESSON #10

“The Joy of Forgiveness”

Text: Psalm 32

Introduction: We are studying a series of lessons on the subject of joy. We know that Jesus commanded His disciples to be joyful. **John 15:11** says, “*These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full.*” The Bible has a lot to say about relationships. One specific thing that we should study more often is the subject of forgiving others. Everyone has been hurt and everyone has probably hurt someone else. Let’s study together...

Discussion:

I. Sin Will Affect Our Relationships

What had God done for David? (vs.1-2)

What had David done against God? (vs.3-7)

What had David decided to change? (vs.8-11)

How did this influence David’s relationship with God? (**Psalm 65:3, Psalm 86:5**)

II. Conflict Will Affect Our Relationships

We can choose ignorance (**Judges 17:6, Romans 3:9-26**).

We can choose bitterness (**Ephesians 4:31-32, Hebrews 10:30, Hebrews 12:14-15**).

We can choose forgiveness (**Matthew 6:14-15, Matthew 18:21-35, Colossians 3:12-13**).

We can choose repentance (**Matthew 18:21-35, Isaiah 1:18, Ezekiel 36:25, I John 1:8-9**).

III. Mercy Will Affect Our Relationships

Rediscover the person’s humanity (**Romans 3:9-26**).

Surrender the desire for vengeance (**Hebrews 10:19-39**).

Empower others with your great example (**Luke 5:17-26**).

IV. Change Will Affect Our Relationships

Don’t forgive someone too quickly (**Matthew 18:21-35**).

Don’t forgive someone too late (**Matthew 5:23-24**).

Don’t forgive someone based on their repentance (**Luke 23:34**).

Don’t forget that forgiveness is a process (**Matthew 6:14-15**).

Conclusion: Do you have trouble forgiving others? Have you forgiven yourself? Do you need forgiveness from God? Do you need to receive prayer to encourage you to forgive yourself? Each child of God should drink from the well of joy!!! Are you ready to drink?



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LESSON #11

“The Joy of Giving”

Text: Romans 12:10-13

Introduction: We are studying a series of lessons on the subject of joy. We know that Jesus commanded His disciples to be joyful. **John 15:11** says, “*These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full.*” God goes to great lengths to provide us with great joy. And when He commands us to do things He hopes that eventually we will find joy in following His commands. The Lord wants us to know that giving can bring us much joy. It’s a great Bible subject and we mustn’t be ashamed of it or afraid of talking about it. I want to share a few stories in the Bible with you. Let’s study together...

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LESSON #12

“The Joy of Hope”

Text: Romans 12:10-13

Introduction: We are studying a series of lessons on the subject of joy. We know that Jesus commanded His disciples to be joyful. **John 15:11** says, “*These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full.*” What comes to your mind when you hear the word: Hope? I would like for us to consider biblical hope. Let’s study together...

Discussion:

I. What's So Special About Our Hope?

- This hope is a glorious hope (**Romans 5:1-5**).
- This hope is an abounding hope (**Romans 15:13-14**).
- This hope is an abiding hope (**I Corinthians 13:13**).
- This hope is a bold hope (**II Corinthians 3:12**).
- This hope is a calling hope (**Ephesians 1:15-18**).
- This hope is a saving hope (**I Thessalonians 5:8**).
- This hope is a blessed hope (**Titus 2:13**).
- This hope is a living hope (**I Peter 1:3**).

II. Why Do We Have The Hope?

- There is hope because Jesus is coming (**I Thessalonians 4:15**).
- There is hope because the resurrection is coming (**I Thessalonians 4:16**).
- There is hope because Heaven is coming (**I Thessalonians 4:17**).
- There is hope because comfort is coming (**I Thessalonians 4:17**).
- There is hope because we are secure in Jesus (**I Peter 1:20-21**).
- There is hope because we have been born of God (**I John 5:18**).
- There is hope because we belong to God (**I John 5:19**).
- There is hope because we believe in God (**I John 5:20**).

Conclusion: **Hebrews 7:24-25** says, “*because Jesus lives forever, he has a permanent priesthood. Therefore he is able to save completely those who come to God through him, because he always lives to intercede for them.*” This is our great hope. Jesus has blazed the trail (**Hebrews 12:1-2**). Do you need some of that hope today? Each child of God should drink from the well of joy!!! Are you ready to drink?



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LESSON #13

“The Joy of Integrity”

Text: Titus 2:6-8

Introduction: We are studying a series of lessons on the subject of joy. We know that Jesus commanded His disciples to be joyful. **John 15:11** says, “*These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full.*” We hear the word “integrity” from time to time, but what does it mean? Integrity can be a source of joy to the believer. As a Christian, am I commanded to have integrity or is it just a result of maturity in Christ? Let’s study together...

Discussion:

I. The Bible Consistently Speaks of Integrity

Integrity will resist compromise (**Proverbs 11:3**).
Integrity will resist conformity (**Romans 12:1-2**).
Integrity will resist corruption (**Proverbs 28:21**).
Integrity will resist contentiousness (**John 12:6**).

II. The Bible Characters Show Integrity

Job was a man of integrity (**Job 1:1, 1:20-21, 2:9**).
David was a man of integrity (**Psalms 7, I Samuel 13:14**).
Solomon taught about integrity (**Proverbs 10:9, 28:6**).
Jesus was a man of integrity (**I Peter 2:21-25, Hebrews 2:8-9**).

III. The Bible Considerably Stimulates Integrity

The Bible will stimulate us to be more truthful (**Ephesians 4:25**).
The Bible will stimulate us to be more sincere (**Philippians 1:10**).
The Bible will stimulate us to be more righteous (**Proverbs 14:2**).
The Bible will stimulate us to be more Christ-like (**Philippians 2:5**).

Conclusion: We need to find joy and happiness. We can achieve this by walking with Jesus, being full of the Holy Spirit, and pursuing honorable behavior. When you do the right thing it’s good for the soul! May God bless us when we follow Him more faithfully! Each child of God should drink from the well of joy!!! Are you ready to drink?



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LESSON #14

“The Joy of Kindness”

Text: Ephesians 4:17-32

Introduction: We are studying a series of lessons on the subject of joy. We know that Jesus commanded His disciples to be joyful. **John 15:11** says, “*These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full.*” Why is it so important to be kind? Can that have an influence on our joy as a Christian? What can we do to be more kind toward others? How can we grow in our kindness toward others? Let’s study together...

Discussion:

I. God Is Kind

- He created mankind (**Genesis 1:2**).
- He saved mankind (**Titus 3:4**).
- He keeps His promises (**II Peter 1:4**).
- He encourages men to obey (**Luke 6:35**).
- He rejoices when He is kind (**Luke 15:7**).

II. Jesus Is Kind

- Jesus showed kindness to His mother (**John 2**).
- Jesus showed kindness in His miracles (**Luke 18:38**).
- Jesus showed kindness in His teachings (**Matthew 7:7-11**).
- Jesus showed kindness in His death (**I Peter 2:21-25**).

III. Paul Was Kind

- He taught that ministers must be kind (**II Corinthians 6:4-6**).
- He taught that kindness is a key to a joyful life (**I Thessalonians 5:16**).
- He taught that kindness is an effective weapon (**Romans 5:7-8**).
- He taught that kindness reflects Christian maturity (**Ephesians 4:32**).

Conclusion: What can you do to show kindness to others? We cannot expect people to be kind to us, unless we are kind to them. We must never forget the Golden Rule (**Matthew 7:12**). Don’t allow your attitude rob you of joy. Each child of God should drink from the well of joy!!! Are you ready to drink?



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LESSON #15

“The Joy of Life”

Text: Psalm 33:1-22

Introduction: We are studying a series of lessons on joy.  Love hopes all things – that means we are positive
 Love endures all things – that means we help without complaining

III. Love Forces Us To Give Some Things Up (vs.4-7)

Love does not envy – that means we are not jealous of what others have
 Love does not parade itself – that means we do not brag or boast
 Love is not puffed up – that means we are not full of pride
 Love does not behave rudely – that means we cannot be ugly or act like people of the world
 Love does not seek its own – that means we are not happy stepping all over other people
 Love is not provoked – that means we do not fly into a rage, but keep our temper under control
 Love thinks no evil – that means we have the best possible motives
 Love does not rejoice in iniquity – does not take delight when they are guilty

V. Love Leads Us To Maturity (vs.8-11)

Love will outlast prophecies, tongues, and knowledge.
 Love looks forward, never backward.
 Love leads us away from child-like immaturity.
 Love leads us on toward perfection.

VI. Love Is Everlasting (vs.12-13)

Love will help us to see things clearly.
 Love will help us to see ourselves.
 Love will help us to see others.
 This is why love is the greatest human virtue.

Conclusion: Christians should be known for their love of God, neighbor, enemy and themselves. It is the hallmark of Christianity. Love is embodied in Jesus and should be emulated by His church, Do you have love? Each child of God should drink from the well of joy!!! Are you ready to drink?
