DISCUSSION:

- I. HE SHOWED HIS POWER OVER THE DESTRUCTIVE FORCES OF NATURE
 - A. Storm is raging.
 - B. Do you care that we perish?
 - C. Peace be still!
 - D. Storm ceased raging.
 - E. He can still the tempest in your heart. Jn. 16:33; Phil. 4:7; Isa. 26:3; Psa. 46:10
 - 1. Tempest of loneliness. Mt. 28:20; Heb. 13:5
 - 2. Tempest of fear. Men fear many things. Pro. 29:25; 2 Tim. 1:7
 - 3. Tempest of anxiety. 1 Pet. 5:7; Phil. 4:6,7
 - 4. Tempest of temptation. 1 Cor. 10:13
 - F. He can bring calm to your troubled heart. Jn. 14:1-2

II. HE SHOWED HIS POWER OVER DEMONS - Mark 5:1-20

- A. Man possessed of demons.
 - 1. Chained but broke them.
 - 2. Not in his right mind.
 - 3. People were afraid of him.
 - 4. A wild man.
 - 5. Jesus came to him and put the demons in a herd of swine
 - 6. They ran into the water and were drowned.
 - 7. The man was clothed and in his right mind.
 - 8. He wanted to follow Jesus.
- B. The casting out of demons ceased with the end of the age of miracles.
 - 1. 1 Cor. 13:8-11; Acts 19:15
 - 2. Jesus and Paul had the power to cast out demons but we do not.
- C. Jesus can deliver you from the power of Satan. Col. 1:13-14
 - 1. The prodigal was not in his right mind in the far country. Lk. 15:11-24
 - 2. That is what sin can do to your mind. Rom. 1:18-32
 - 3. Only Jesus can break the shackles of sin. Jn. 8:31-36

III. HE SHOWED HIS POWER OVER DISEASE

- A. He made our bodies. **Jn. 1:1-3; Col. 1.16-17; Heb. 1:1-3**
- B. Why should it be thought strange for Him to help those with physical infirmity?
- C. Woman touched the hem of His garment and was healed.
 - 1. One garment was not as good as another.
 - 2. It took contact with Jesus' garment.
 - 3. The power was not in the garment but in the one wearing the garment.
- D. He can still help with our infirmities. James 5:13-16
- E. The prayer of faith can help sick folk. Mt. 7:7; 21:22
- F. There is a difference in divine healing and miraculous divine healing.
 - 1. When Jesus healed the sick there was an instantaneous cure.

ILL. PETER'S WIFE'S MOTHER

- 2. If men can duplicate the miracles of Jesus, how many people can they feed with five loaves and two fish?
 - 3. He fed 5000.
- G. In the realm of providence, God still helps sick people get well.
- H. Though Paul was an apostle endowed with power to perform miracles (2 Cor. 12:12).
 - 1. He did not always use that power to heal the sick.
 - 2. Timothy is an example. 1 Tim. 5:23
 - 3. Epaphroditus is another example. Phil 2:25-30
- I. We need to have more faith in the prayers we offer for the sick. 1 Jn. 5:14-15

IV. HE SHOWED HIS POWER OVER DEATH

- A. Raised child from the dead. Mk. 5
- B. He showed his power over death at the tomb of Lazarus. Jn. 11
- C. He showed power over death when he raised the son of the widow of Nain.
- D. Because of his death and resurrection death has been defeated. Rev. 1:18

1 Cor. 15:12-19, 50-58; 1 Thess. 4:13-18

E. Jesus answered the age old question of life beyond the grave. Job 14:14;

Jn. 11:24-25

- A. One day we will cross over to the other side. **Heb. 9:27**
- B. What will it be like for you on the other side?
- C. What do you need to do?

TEXT: Romans 3:24

INTRODUCTION:

- A. Give background of text.
- B. Jesus has justified us by His precious blood through grace.
- C. What exactly does that mean?

DISCUSSION:

I. THREE WORDS TO UNDERSTAND

- A. Justification. A judicial term. When we plead guilty to our sins faith and works of obedience justify us. **Heb. 8:12; 1 Cor. 6:9-11**
- B. Redemption. A financial,term. A ransom is paid. **Mt. 20:28; 1 Tim. 2:4-6**"JESUS paid it all"
- C. Propitiation. A sacrificial term. To appease God's wrath. Sin angers God: **Acts 5:1-10**; **Lev. 10:1-2**, **Heb. 10:31**; **12:29**; **Isa. 53:10**

II. WE ARE JUSTIFIED...

A. By grace. **Rom. 3:21-26**.

There three components involved in grace. **Eph. 2:4-10. Tit. 3:4-7**

- 1. Mercy. Feeling for another. Tit. 3:5
- 2. Love. Desiring what is best for another. Jn. 3:16
- 3. Kindness. Doing what is good for another. **Tit. 3:3-8**
- B. By faith. **Rom. 3:27-31**
 - 1. Involves an acceptance of established facts. This is the intellectual component.
 - 2. Involves trust. This is the emotional component.
 - 3. Involves obedience. This is the volitional component.
- C. This is demonstrated by Abraham.
 - 1. He was justified by grace. He was promised a son. He did not merit this promise.
 - 2. The promise was made because God was merciful, loving and kind to Abraham.
 - 3. He was justified by faith. He was 75 years old when his son was promised.

Gen. 12:1-4. It was not fulfilled till he was 100. Gen. 21:5

- 4. He was unwavering in in his faith. Rom. 4:20-21
- 5. He was justified by grace and faith coming together. By grace through faith.
- 6. By grace God's part. Through faith man's part.

III. WE ARE SAVED BY GRACE

- A. God provided the means of salvation. Rom. 3;24; Tit. 3:7
 - 1. Justified by grace.
 - 2. Justified by faith. Rom. 3:25-26, 28; 5:1

- 3. Justified by the resurrection of Christ. Rom. 4:25
- 4. Justified by blood. Rom. 5:9
- 5. Justified by faith and baptism. Acts 18:8; 1 Cor. 6:9-11
- B. Eph. 2:4-10; Tit. 2;11-15

IV. WE ARE SAVED BY FAITH

- A. We are justified by faith. Rom. 5:1
- B. We are saved by the gospel. Rom. 1:16; Eph. 1:13; Jas. 1:21
- C. We are saved by the grace of God. Eph. 2:8
- D. We are saved by repentance of sin. 2 Cor. 7:10
- E. We are saved by confession of faith in Christ. Rom. 10:9-10
- F. We are saved by immersion in water for remission of sins. Acts 2:3&; 1 Pet. 3:21
- G. Hence, we are not saved by faith only.

V. WE ARE SAVED BY WORKS

- A. KINDS OF WORKS.
 - 1. Meritorious works. Tit. 3:5; Eph. 2:8-9
 - 2. Works of darkness. Eph. 5:11
 - 3. Works of the flesh. Gal. 5:19-21
- B. There is an obedient faith that manifests itself in action. Jas. 2:17-18; 2:24-25
- C. Faith itself is a work. Jn. 6:28-29. The faith that saves is an obedient faith.

Rom. 7:17-18; Heb. 5:8-9; 1 Pet. 1:22; Heb. 11:5,7,8

- D. **Isa 38:17**, "You have lovingly delivered my soul from the pit of corruption for you have cast all my sins behind your back."
 - 1. With forgiveness, God takes my sins and casts them behind his back.
 - 2. He has no more interest in our sins. Acts 3:19; Mic. 7:19; Psa. 103:12

- A. Remember the plan of salvation.
- B. What do you need to do?
 - 1. You must hear the gospel in order to be saved. Romans 10:17
 - 2. You must believe in Jesus Christ in order to be saved. John 8:24
 - 3. You must repent of sins in order to be saved. Luke 13:3
 - 4. You must confess faith in Jesus Christ in order to be saved. Matthew 10:
 - 5. You must be baptized for the remission of sins in order to be saved. Mark 16:16
 - 6. You must live a faithful life and keep yourself from sin and be ready for when Jesus comes again. **Revelation 2:10**

20 Gospel Sermons by Billy Lambert LESSON THREE: GOD REVEALED HIMSELF

<u>TEXT</u>: **John 1:14-18**

INTRODUCTION:

- A. Give background of text.
- B. Jesus came into the world to reveal the Father.
- C. What can we learn from the Word of God about this revelation?

DISCUSSION:

I. GOD REVEALED HIMSELF IN JESUS

- A. **John 1:14**, "And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth."
- B. **John 1:18**, "No man hath seen God at any time, the only begotten Son, which is in the bosom of the Father, he hath declared him."
- C. **Phil. 2:5-8**, "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross."
- D. "One of the most defensible and utterly devastating arguments for the existence of God is the historical person and influence of Jesus of Nazareth. There is absolutely no way to explain JESUS apart from the fact that He came from God." Wayne Jackson

II. THERE ARE FOUR EVIDENCES FOR THE DIVINITY OF JESUS

A. He is a true historical character.

- 1. Roman historian, Tactius in commenting on the name Christian: "Christ, from whom they derive their name, was condemned to death by the procurator Pontius Pilate in the reign of the Emperor Tiberius". Werner Kelly, THE BIBLE AS HISTORY
- 2. Jewish historian, Flavius Josephus, in writing about the events under Pilate said, "There was about this time JESUS, a wise man, if it be lawful to call him a man, for he was a doer of wonderful works, a teacher of such men as had a veneration for truth. He drew over to him both many of the Jews and many of the Gentiles: he as the Christ." William Whiston, translator of the works of Josephus.
- B. Prophesies were fulfilled by JESUS.
 - 1. He fulfilled minute details which were written hundreds of years before He came into the world. (**Lk. 24:44-49**)
 - 2. There are over 300 prophesies related to His life, birth, death, and resurrection.
 - 3. How do you explain this apart from God?

- C. His miracles testify to His Deity.
 - 1. Consider the fact that:
 - He showed He was Divine by walking on the water. (**John 6:15-21**)
 - He showed He was Divine by stilling the storm of the sea. (Mt. 8:23-27)
 - He showed He was Divine by making the blind to see (Mt. 9:27-31)
 - He showed He was Divine by cleansing the leper. (**LK. 5:12-14**)
 - He showed He was Divine by healing the deaf and mute. (Mk. 7:31-37)
 - He showed He was Divine by multiplying loaves and fish. (**John 6:10-12**)
 - He showed He was Divine by raising the dead. (Luke 7, Luke 8, John 11)
 - 2. Skeptics claim these are made up stories.
 - 3. The gospels were not written until years after these events happened.
 - 4. The writer's eyewitnesses of these events and no one disputed them.
- D. The resurrection of Christ is crucial to His claim of being God's Son.
 - 1. His enemies did not dispute it. (Acts 2:24-31)
 - 2. There were witnesses of His resurrection. (1 Cor. 15:1-8)
 - 3. Many of the disciples spent their lives preaching the resurrection to their own peril.
 - 4. If JESUS was not raised from the dead why was it not announced in the same city where he was buried?

- A. Remember the plan of salvation.
- B. What do you need to do?
 - 1. You must hear the gospel in order to be saved. Romans 10:17
 - 2. You must believe in Jesus Christ in order to be saved. John 8:24
 - 3. You must repent of sins in order to be saved. Luke 13:3

- C. What will you do with Jesus?

20 Gospel Sermons by Billy Lambert LESSON FOUR: PRAISE GOD FROM WHOM ALL BLESSINGS FLOW

TEXT: 1 Chronicles 29:13

INTRODUCTION:

- A. These words were spoken by David near the end of an illustrious career.
- B. He had so much for which to be thankful.
 - 1. God had helped him defeat Goliath.
 - 2. God forgave him when he sinned. **Ps. 51:1-3; 2 Sam. 12:13**
 - 3. God allowed him to write some of the most inspiring poetry in print (Psalms).
 - 4. God allowed David to make preparations for building the temple.
- C. David challenged the people to join him I'm preparing for the building the temple.
 - 1. David did not ask the people to do what he had not already done. 1 Chr. 29:2-3
 - 2. He challenged them "who then is willing to consecrate himself this day to the Lord?"
- D. David had given more than he had purposed to give (1 Chr. 29:3).
- E. David was generous because he was grateful. (1 Chron. 29:13).
- F. What were the keys in David having such an attitude toward giving to God?

DISCUSSION:

- I. HE RECOGNIZED GOD'S DIVINE OWNERSHIP (1 Chr. 29:11,12,16)
 - A. Everything belongs to God. V. 11-12, 16. (all is yours)
 - 1. The silver and gold is His. Hag. 2:8
 - 2. Your soul is His. Ezk. 18:4
 - 3. The cattle on a thousand hills are His. Ps. 50:10,11
 - 4. We speak of my house, my car, my money etc. But in reality it is only loaned to us.
 - B. There is not one thing man can give God that He did not already own. Vv. 12,14
 - C. Note the question, "But who am I and who are my people that we should be able to offer as generously as this?"
 - 1. We are weak and frail. (Ps. 39:4-5).
 - 2. We are nothing without Him. (Jno. 15:5).
 - 3. Suppose God took back everything He has given you?
 - 4. What would you have? Job 1:20-23; Jas. 1:17
 - 5. We had nothing when we came into the world and we leave with nothing. 1 Tim. 6:7
 - D. Howard Hughes at one time was an extremely wealthy man. Someone asked, "How much did he leave when he died"? He left it all!
- II. HE RECOGNIZED THE NEED TO SUPPORT GOD'S WORK (1 Chr. 29:16).
 - A. We are fellow workers with God. 1 Cor. 3:9
 - B. He depends on us to get His work accomplished.
 - 1. He did not place His work into the hands of angels.
 - 2. He charged us to carry out His work.

- C. Today His work involves:
 - 1. Evangelism. Mt. 28:19-20; Mk. 16:15
 - 2. Benevolence. Gal. 6:10
 - 3. Edification. Acts 20:32; Eph. 4:16
- D. It takes resources (money) to preach the gospel and to help the unfortunate.
 - 1. Lip service will not get the work done. Jas. 2:14-17
 - 2. Love requires that we do more than talk a good game. 1 Jn. 3:17-18
- E. We have the resources to do God's work. We are wealthy.
 - 1. Look at what we own: fine cars, houses, food, clothes, gadgets of all kinds, etc.
 - 2. It is a frightening thought of standing before the God of heaven and earth not having given to support His cause.
- F. There is no record of anyone in any age who gave less than 10 percent to the Lord.
 - 1. Suppose your gross income is \$1000 per week and you decide to give 10 percent that means your contribution would be \$100 a week.
 - 2. God is to get our first fruits (Pro. 3:9-10) and not off our adjusted income.
 - 3. A barber had a man who worked in his shop and when he paid the man he noticed he would count out his pay and make two stacks. The barber asked why he did that. He said one stack was God's and he gave to God off the top.
 - 4. Giving me his much scares some and they say "I can't afford to give that much because I have bills to pay".
 - 5. Consider this question: "what shall I render to the Lord for all his benefits to me?"

III. HE RECOGNIZED THE NEED TO BE A WILLING GIVER TO GOD'S WORK (1 Chr. 29:17).

- A. It is difficult to find a better attitude than the brethren in Macedonia.
 - 1. They gave during a time of great trial and affliction.
 - 2. They gave out of a joyful heart.
 - 3. They gave even though they were in deep poverty.
 - 4. They gave beyond their power.
 - 5. They FIRST gave themselves to the Lord.
- B. Giving is a matter of attitude.
 - 1. God the first giver gave out of a heart of love. Jno. 3:16
 - 2. Our giving should also be out of a heart of love. 2 Cor. 8:8, 24

- A. PRAISE GOD FROM WHOM ALL BLESSINGS FLOW!
- B. Praise Him:
 - 1. With the fruit of our lips.
 - 2. With a life of dedication.
 - 3. With the whole heart.
 - 4. With our possessions.
- C. "Who then is willing to consecrate himself this day to the Lord?"
- D. Remember the plan of salvation.

TEXT: **2 Timothy 3:1-7**

INTRODUCTION:

- A. We live in turbulent times.
- B. Time of:
 - 1. War
 - 2. Violence
 - 3. Hatred
 - 4. Murder
 - 5. Drug abuse
 - 6. Disregard of God's instruction regarding the home
 - 7. Corruption in high places
 - 8. Doubt and disbelief
 - 9. Hopelessness
 - 10. Rejection of the Bible
- C. JESUS has a word for our day.

DISCUSSION:

I. HE HAS A MESSAGE OF LOVE IN A TIME OF HATE

- A. The Bible is filled with the message of love.
 - 1. Love God.
 - 2. Love neighbor.
 - 3. Love enemies.
 - 4. Love all men.
 - 5. Love family.
 - 6. Love fellow Christians.
- B. He first loved us. Jn. 15:13; Rom. 5:6-9; 1 Jn. 4:9-10
- C. Love begins with God. Jn. 3:16 HE IS LOVE
- D. He loves you. Gal. 2:20
- E. We are to love our fellow man. 1 Jn. 3:15; 4:20
- F. Spread love, not hate. 1 Cor. 13:1-13

II. CHRIST HAS A MESSAGE OF PEACE IN A TIME OF WAR

- A. Men have been fighting one another since the beginning of time.
- B. Men go to war because of selfishness. Jas. 4:1
- C. JESUS came to bring peace into the world. Isa. 9:6; Lk. 2:14; Rom. 5:1;

EPH. 2:14.17: Col. 1:20

- 1. Peace with God. Rom. 5:1; 6:1-5; 17-18
- 2. Peace with all men. Rom. 22:17-21; 14:19

- 3. Peace within our hearts. Jn. 16:33; Phil. 4:6-7
- 4. Eternal peace. Rev. 14:13
- D. It is time to lay down the weapons of war and submit to the Prince of Peace.

III. CHRIST HAS A MESSAGE OF HOPE FOR A TIME OF DESPAIR

- A. ILL. A submarine was disabled on bottom of ocean. Some divers went to see what could learn. They heard a tapping noise in Morse code: is there any hope?
- B. Lot of people asking that question.
 - 1. Those who are in the rubble of an earthquake and wait to be found.
 - 2. Those who have lost everything in a hurricane.
 - 3. Those whose children have become entangled in the web of drugs.
 - 4. Those who are single parents and struggle from day to day to feed their family.
 - 5. Those who are critically ill and do not know if they will live.
- C. Jesus came to lift the cloud of hopelessness and despair and embolden us with hope now and forevermore.
 - 1. His death gives us hope. Rom. 8:24; 1 Tim. 1:1
 - His death gives us of forgiveness. Eph. 1:7; Mt 26:28
 - His death gives us everlasting life. Tit. 3:7
 - 2. His resurrection gives us hope. 1 Pet. 1:3
 - 3. His second coming gives us hope. Tit. 2:11-14; 1 Thess. 4:13-18
- D. There is a light burning brightly at the end of life's journey.

- A. Keep your eye on where you are going.
- B. ILL. There were some men working in rock quarry. These men had to cross a narrow boardwalk while pushing a wheelbarrow filled with rock. They were told don't look down. Keep your eyes on where you are going.
- C. We need to take that advice... keep looking to where you are going!
- D. What do you need to do?
 - 1. You must hear the gospel in order to be saved. Romans 10:17
 - 2. You must believe in Jesus Christ in order to be saved. John 8:24
 - 3. You must repent of sins in order to be saved. Luke 13:3
 - 4. You must confess faith in Jesus Christ in order to be saved. **Matthew 10:**
 - 5. You must be baptized for the remission of sins in order to be saved. Mark 16:16
 - 6. You must live a faithful life and keep yourself from sin and be ready for when Jesus comes again. **Revelation 2:10**

20 Gospel Sermons by Billy Lambert LESSON SIX: HAVE YOU RECEIVED CHRIST?

TEXT: Colossians 2:6

INTRODUCTION:

- A. Give background of text.
- B. Many speak of receiving Christ but how are we to receive Him?
- C. What some teach about receiving Christ is out of harmony with the Word of God.

DISCUSSION:

I. HOW WE DO NOT RECEIVE CHRIST?

- A. We do not receive Him by thinking about it. Pro. 14:12
 - 1. A person may imagine many things that are not true.
 - 2. Just thinking you are saved does not make it so.
- B. We do not receive Him by faith alone. Jn. 1:11-12; Jas. 2:24; Jn. 12:42
- C. We do not receive Him by repeating a prayer.
 - 1. Some read **Acts 2:21** as a proof text for the sinner's prayer.
 - 2. Notice some other scriptures that have the phrase "shall be saved".

Jn. 10:9; Mk. 16:16

- 3. These are equal to each other.
- 4. When people were asked "What Must I do to be saved?", they were not told to repeat a prayer.

II. HOW DO WE RECEIVE CHRIST?

- A. One must receive the Word. Acts 2:41; Jas. 1:21-25; Col. 1:3-6; 1:23
- B. You receive Christ by receiving the gospel. 1 Cor. 15:1-4; Rom. 1:16; Gal. 1:6-9
 - 1. Like the Samaritans. Acts 8:5. 12-13
 - 2. Like the Eunuch. Acts 8:26-40
 - 3. You cannot receive Christ without receiving the Word. Jn. 12:47-48; 2 Jn. 9
- C. You must believe and obey the gospel:
 - 1. The people on Pentecost. Acts 2:36-47

 - We need commitment.
 - 4. ILL. Trees during hurricanes. Pine trees have deep roots and stand the test. Pecan trees are not as deeply rooted and are easily uprooted.

- B. The word "healed" in Isaiah 53:5 does not refer to physical healing.
 - 1. The context will not allow for such an interpretation.
 - 2. He was "wounded" for our "transgressions".
 - 3. Peter did not have physical healing in mind. 1 Pet. 2:24
 - 4. Jesus used the word "healed" (**Mt. 13:15**) but the parallel passage clarifies what He had in mind (**Mk. 4:11**).
 - 5. Healed equals forgiveness.

- C. There is spiritual healing (forgiveness) because of His death. Eph. 1:7; Mt. 26:28
 - 1. His death was vicarious.
 - 2. "Wounded for our transgressions". 2 Cor. 5:21
 - 3. If our sins are forgiven it will be because of His death. Heb. 9:12-22

- G. Obey the gospel. 2 Thess. 1:7-9; 1 Pet. 4:17; Acts 18:8

- A. Remember the plan of salvation.
- B. What must we do to be saved?
 - 1. You must hear the gospel in order to be saved. **Romans 10:17** says, "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God."
 - 2. You must believe in Jesus Christ in order to be saved. **John 8:24** says, "Therefore I said to you that you will die in your sins; for if you do not believe that I am He, you will die in your sins."
 - 3. You must repent of sins in order to be saved. **Luke 13:3** says, "I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish."
 - 4. You must confess faith in Jesus Christ in order to be saved. **Matthew 10:32** says, "Therefore whoever confesses Me before men, him I will also confess before My Father who is in heaven."
 - 5. You must be baptized for the remission of sins in order to be saved. **Mark 16:16** says, "He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned."
 - 6. Then you must live a faithful life and keep yourself from sin and be ready for when Jesus comes again. **Revelation 2:10** says, "Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life."
- C. After we obey the gospel we must go and teach it to others (Matt. 28:18-19).

DISCUSSION:

I. PERFECT - James 1:25

- A. Something perfect can't be improved on by addition to or subtraction
 - 1. Warning in front middle & last. Deut. 4:2
 - 2. Add not to his word. Prov. 30:6; Rev. 22:18-19
 - 3. Jesus was perfect and could not be improved on.
- B. Law of Moses could not ring perfect (**Heb. 7:19**)
 - 1. Only a shadow. **Heb. 10:1**
 - 2. Eternal life known only by degree. Heb. 11:26-27; 1 Pet. 1:10-12
 - 3. The Holiest of Holies made possible with Christ. Heb. 9:6-12

II. POWERFUL - Romans 1:15

- A. Power came from Greek word DUNAMIS
 - 1. Origin of word dynamic Dynamo Dynamite
 - 2. God has creative power nature power can control what he chooses
 - 3. Gospel is his method and it has his power unto salvation
 - 4. What is we preach another gospel? Gal 1:6-9
- B. What the Word Will Do
 - 1. Produce faith. Rom. 10:17
 - 2. Begotten and saved by word. 1 Pet 1:23; James 1:21
 - 3. It guickens and causes us to want to obey. Heb. 4:12
 - 4. Demands obedience. John 12:42-43
 - 5. Why resort to: Emotionalism; Gimmicks, Social Reform, Etc.?

III. COMPLETE – II Timothy 3:16-17

- A. Bible is al-sufficient, adequate and adaptable to every human need.
 - 1. We have been given all things that pertain to life and Godliness (II Pet. 1:3)
 - 2. This is why we say, "Speak where Bible speaks and be silent where Bible is silent." (1 Pet 4:11)
 - 3. If we accept ritual-handbook, catechism, manual, discipline, confession of faith or prayer book, this makes void our faith in all sufficiency of scriptures.
 - 4. If Bible thoroughly furnishes to every good work, why have a supplementary book?
 - B. Some things taught in **II Timothy 3:16-17**
 - 1. Give by inspiration (God breathed) Gal. 1:11-12
 - 2. Profitable for doctrine (Teaching) II John 9
 - 3. Reproof **Eph.5:11 II Timothy 4:2** God anticipated every error
 - 4. Correction (Amend life) only thing to cause us to want to correct our life. **Rom. 12:1-2**
 - 5. Instruction in righteousness (Guidelines)
 - 6. Mature in every good work
 - 7. Why have supplementary book? (Always changing)

IV. ENDURING - Matthew 24:35; 1 Peter 1:24-25

- A. Word is unmoved, fixed and permanent.
 - 1. Kingdoms rise and fall but word abides (19 civilizations risen & fallen)
 - 2. Men have tried to destroy Bible.
 - 3. Men have and do pervert the Bible but don't change what it says
- B. Because it endures, it will judge John 12:48; Romans 2:16; Rev. 20:12

- A. If Gospel is powerful-perfect-complete and enduring, why aren't all men saved?
- B. Not God's fault Extends grace Not willing that any should perish.
- C. Man is free moral agent if not saved is because he will not obey **John 5:40**
- D. If you are not a Christian, let power of Gospel operate on your heart.
- E. What do you need to do?
 - 1. You must hear the gospel in order to be saved. **Romans 10:17**

20 Gospel Sermons by Billy Lambert LESSON TWENTY: BEWARE LEST THOU FORGET

TEXT: Deut. 6:12; Heb. 10:23-31; 2 Pet. 1:12-14

Introduction

- A. Man is prone to remember the things he ought to forget and forget the things he ought to remember.
- B. We should forget: Evil, wrongs we have suffered and our old sins (Phil. 3:13-14).
- C. However, the warning comes ringing across the centuries, "Beware lest than forget."
- D. Some of life's greatest things are often forgotten.

DISCUSSION:

- I. THE ROOT OF THE MATTER: "BEWARE LEST THOU FORGET GOD"
 - A. **Eccl. 12:1** God is worthy of being remembered.
 - 1. Because of His omnipotence (Amos 4:13).
 - 2. Because of His omniscience (Prov. 15:3; Psa. 139:1-4).
 - 3. Because of His omnipresence (Job 23:9-10).
 - 4. Because of His infinite goodness to man (Rom. 11:22).
 - B. Yet, many have forgotten God (Jer. 2:32).
 - 1. A maid cannot forget her ornaments.
 - 2. A bride does not forget her wedding gown.
 - 3. But multitudes have forgotten God.
 - C. The basic mistake of the rich farmer was forgetting God (Lk. 12:26-21).
 - 1. He talked of his goods, his fruits, his barns, etc.
 - 2. Not once did he take God into account.
 - D. As in the care of Israel and the rich farmer, prosperity can cause a people to forget God (**Deut. 32:15; Rom. 3:18**).

II. THINGS WE OUGHT NEVER TO FORGET

- A. Beware lest thou forget the word of God (Jas. 1:25; Heb. 2:1-3).
 - 1. One of the main duties of faithful preacher is to remind men of what they have been taught (2 Pet. 1:12-13; 1 Tim. 4:6).
 - 2. We need to remember the word of the Lord (**Lk. 24:8**).
 - a. We need to remember the Words of Christ on creation (Mt. 19:4).
 - b. We need to remember the words of Christ on His deity, "Before Abraham was" (**Micah 5:2**).
 - c. We need to remember the word of Christ on His mission (**Lk. 19:10; Jn. 17:4**).
 - d. We need to remember the words of Christ on his authority (Mt. 28:18; Jn. 12:45).
 - e. We need to remember the words of Christ on heaven (Jn. 14:1-3).
 - 3. The man is foolish, who forgets the words of Christ (Mt. 7:21-27).

- B. Beware lest thou forget the benefits of God. (Psa. 103:2).
 - 1. Think of the blessings we have received (Jas. 1:17; 1 Chron. 29:11-12; Deut. 8:18).
 - 2. "Count your blessings name them one by one and it will surprise you what the Lord hath done."
 - 3. The most benighted soul the world has to offer is the man who has forgotten what God has done for him (**Lk. 17:11-17**).
 - 4. There is not a clearer manifestation of ingratitude than a failure to give as God has blessed us (**Acts 20:35; 2 Cor. 9:6-7**).
- C. Beware lest thou forget the consequences of sin (Lk. 17:32).
 - In fleeing Sodom Mrs. Lot looked back and was turned into a pillar of salt a monument to remind us of the consequences of sin (Num. 32:23; Gal. 6:7-8; Heb. 10:26-31).
 - 2. Pay day is coming (**Rom. 14:12**).
- D. Beware lest thou forget to assemble to worship.
 - 1. One of the clearest signs a man has forgotten God is failure to worship God.
 - 2. "Why should we attend the services of the church", one might ask.
 - a. To shoe the proof of our love (Jn. 14:14).
 - b. To show our faith (Jas. 2:18).
 - c. To increase our knowledge (2 Pet. 1:5).
 - e. Meet with the Lord (Mt. 18:20).
 - f. To become more like the God we serve.
 - 3. The seriousness of this is seen in the words of **Heb. 10:24-26**.
 - a. We do not know why there may have been negligent.
 - b. It may have been a fear of persecution.
 - c. Maybe they lacked interest.
 - d. Perhaps they were not well taught.
- E. Beware lest thou forget what Jesus has done for us (2 Pet. 1:9).
 - 1. Jesus instituted the Lord's supper as a memorial of His work (1 Cor. 11:28-30).
 - 2. The Lord's supper is a looking back (to His death) a looking in (each examine himself) a looking forward (till he come).
- F. Beware lest thou forget your first love (**Rev. 2:5**).
 - 1. Many are in a backslider state (Gal. 6:1; Jas. 5:19-20; 1 Cor. 10:12; 2 Pet. 2:20-22).
 - 2. Do you recall the place that prayer once played in your life?
 - 3. Do you recall how you once read and studied the Bible?
 - 4. Do you recall how you once were very sensitive to sin?
 - 5. There are many like the prodigal who need to return home (**Lk. 15:11-24**).

III. RESULTS OF FORGETTING GOD

- A. Forgetting God is a devastating force that can weaken and destroy nations (**Ps. 9:17**).
- B. If we forget God in this life, memory will haunt us throughout eternity (Lk. 16:19-31).

- A. Have you been leaving God out of your life?
- B. Remember God now... while there is time!
