"Jesus Calms The Storm"

<u>Introduction</u>: The calming of the storm is found in three gospels (Matthew 8:23-27, Mark 4:37-41, Luke 8:22-25). Tonight we will study the events in the gospel of Mark. John Mark reveals that they had a busy day of teaching and ministry. They were probably exhausted. However, the ministry of Jesus was only beginning. They were headed to a new work. Let's study together...

<u>Conclusion</u>: When we go through a storm, or learn to understand the signs, wonders, and mighty works of God, we should tell others about what He has done. If we are looking for mercy and grace to help in time of need we need to turn to Jesus (**Hebrews 4:14-16, 7:25**). If we are looking for peace to guard our hearts and minds we need to look to Jesus (**Philippians 4:6-7**). What storm are you facing right now? Are you ready for the "greatest" storm (**II Peter 3:7-12, II Corinthians 5:10**)? If you take the steps necessary for salvation you can have safety through this storm! Your brothers and sisters are ready to help you and your God is watching over you!

"Jesus Walks On Water"

<u>Introduction</u>: The story of Jesus walking on the water is recorded in three of the gospel accounts (Matthew 14:22-32, Mark 6:47-52, John 6:16-21). This is actually the 5th of seven miracles in John and he tells us that they were 3 ½ miles out to sea. Jesus would defy gravity in the middle of the sea! Let's study the story together...

Conclusion: What if you are in the middle of the storm? Don't be troubled! The ship is coming into shore. The sea will calm down. The storm will pass. The rainbow will follow! AND you will have a great story to tell! **Proverbs 3:5-6** says, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths." What stands in your way of trusting God? Your own understanding! We have to learn to put ourselves in the Lord's hands. Come to Jesus! He is ready to help you!

"Jesus Multiplies Loaves & Fishes"

<u>Introduction</u>: On Sunday nights we are studying the miracles of Jesus. For the first few lessons we focused on His authority over nature. We have noticed the authority of Jesus over the winds and waves AND that He has the ability to walk on the water. Tonight we will focus on how He could multiply the loaves and the fishes. There are actually two stories that might get confused: the feeding of 5,000 (Matthew 14:14-21, Mark 6:30-44, Luke 9:10-17, John 6:1-14) and the feeding of 4,000 (Matthew 15:32-39, Mark 8:1-9). Let's look at them from the gospel of Mark's perspective. Let's study together...

Conclusion: Don't forget to consider Mark 6:15-16. What were they looking for at that time? The common people did not reject Him, because they thought of Him as a prophet: Elijah (Malachi 4:5) or the prophet foretold by Moses (Deuteronomy 18:15). Some of His disciples doubted. His brothers doubted. And, we too may doubt. Why were the stories about Jesus written? John 20:30-31 says "Jesus did many other signs in the presence of His disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name." We are supposed to learn something from these stories and signs! What have you learned? When God has provided for you, what did you do? If you are outside of Christ, will you come to him? Do you understand He wants to provide for you, care for you and love you? Come to Jesus! He is ready to help!

"Jesus Controls Sea Creatures"

<u>Introduction</u>: On Sunday nights we are studying the miracles of Jesus. We have previously noticed some of His authority over nature. We have noticed the authority of Jesus over the winds and waves, the ability to walk on the water, and that He could multiply the loaves and the fishes. Tonight we will continue to build on that theme and recognize how He controls the creatures of the sea. We will consider three powerful stories: The fish with a coin in its mouth (Matthew 17:24-27), followed by two huge catches of fish (Luke 5:4-11, John 21:1-11). What happened then? And what does it mean now? Let's study together...

Conclusion: God will use us even when we fail. We cannot stay down. We have to get back up. The Lord may use stories, people, or real life situations to draw our attention back to Him. We may have seen it, done it, or read it 1000x, but it just takes that one time to make it click! Simon Peter just needed to be reminded of who he was and what he was supposed to be doing. Jesus attempts to wake him up in John 21:15-17. If Jesus could control the creatures of the sea, don't you think He can control your life? If He could provide a shekel in the mouth of the fish, don't you think He can provide for you? If He could overwhelm the nets with fish, and the disciples with blessings, don't you think He's watching out for you? What have you learned? Will you trust Him? Will you follow Him?

<u>Introduction</u>: On Sunday nights we are studying the miracles of Jesus. We have previously noticed His authority over nature: the winds and waves, the ability to walk on the water, multiply the loaves and the fishes and control creatures of the sea. Tonight we will continue to build on that theme and recognize how He can both create and destroy. We will consider two powerful stories and connect the dots: the fig tree that withers (Matthew 21:18-22, Mark 11:12-14, 20-25), and the water turned into wine (John 2:1-11). Let's study together...

<u>Introduction</u>: We have been studying about the miracles of Jesus. We have previously noticed His authority over nature. Jesus has authority of Jesus over the winds and waves. He has the ability to walk on the water. He could multiply the loaves and the fishes. He could control creatures of the sea. He could create and destroy. In this lesson we are going to consider another amazing power of Jesus that should cause us to marvel. We are going to consider His ability to change His image at a moment's notice. Let's study together...

Are you walking faithfully with Him? How can you ensure He will take you home with Him? Come to Jesus!

<u>Introduction</u>: We have been studying about the miracles of Jesus. We have previously noticed His authority over nature. Today we are going to transition into another phase of His miracles... the power of healing. Over the next several weeks we will see His healing over multitudes and over individuals. He is healing those with leprosy, healing the blind, healing the mute, and healing the paralyzed. What can we learn about what He did for the multitudes? Let's study together...

Conclusion: The great revival passage in the Old Testament is II Chronicles 7:14 which says, "If My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land." Our land needs healing! However, we must turn to Him! If the words of Christ are not enough to change your mind, and if His actions are not enough to break your heart, maybe His tears are enough to penetrate your soul. He wept for you (Matthew 26, Mark 14, Luke 22, John 17)! Are you a child of God? Are you walking faithfully with Him? Are you broken? Do you need healing? Come to Jesus! He is ready to help you!

<u>Introduction</u>: We have been studying about the miracles of Jesus. We have previously noticed His authority over nature. Last Sunday we began to look that the power of healing. We studied passages that tell us about Jesus doing miracles in Galilee, Judea, Samaria, Phoenicia, and Jerusalem. Today we will focus on Him healing the lepers and the lame. Let's study together...

He is ready to help you!

"Jesus Casts Out Demons"

Introduction: We have been studying about the miracles of Jesus. John the Baptizer sent some of his own disciples to inquire of Jesus about these events. You might recall that Jesus said, "Go and tell John the things which you hear and see: The blind see and the lame walk; the lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear; the dead are raised up and the poor have the gospel preached to them. And blessed is he who is not offended because of Me." (Matthew 11:4-6) In this series we have noticed most of those things. However, in this lesson, we will notice something virtually unparalleled to any other miracle worker before Jesus, the power to cast out demons! Let's study together...
