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### **LESSON ONE: Rooted By Salvation**

Introduction: We live in a world full of trouble and turmoil. It is easy for us to be swayed by the winds of change. God wants us to be grounded. We need to be rooted in Christ to have a strong foundation. Have you ever wondered who could be saved? People have asked similar questions before (Matthew 19:25, Luke 18:18, Acts 2:36, Acts 16:30, 22:10). What answers did they receive? We must be secure in our own salvation (I John 5:13). What does that mean? Let's study together...

They worry something might be taken from them. People think it means that we have to give up something that we can't live without. Sacrifice means loss. What does that mean? Let's study together...

We need to be rooted in Christ to have a strong foundation. However, we need to "branch" out and serve others. It is often difficult when we work because we often feel unappreciated. Yet, the Bible clearly tells us to be a servant. The words serve, service, and servant can be found hundreds of times in the Bible. What should we learn from these texts? Let's study together...

  - The foolish put off the needs of others (**Proverbs 3:28**).
  - The foolish forget their position with others (**Proverbs 3:29**).
  - The foolish fight with others (**Proverbs 3:30**).
- Remember the Golden Rule (Matthew 7:12)
- *Remember the Greatest Commands (Mark 12:28-31)*

<u>Conclusion</u>: When we offer ourselves to serve the Lord, God can do some amazing things! Don't worry about whether or not you'll fail, or whether or not you'll do it right, or whether or not you're the right person for the job, just serve God to the best of your ability! Are you ready to serve? Are you rooted in Christ?

Do you love God emotionally, spiritually, intellectually, and physically? Are you rooted in Christ?

- Loving Yourself Means Self-Esteem
  - Our self-esteem is formed by God's loving hands (Isaiah 64:8)
  - Our self-esteem is solidified by God's Son (John 3:16, Galatians 6:3–5)
  - Our self-esteem is affected by our relationship with Christ (Romans 12:1–8)
- Loving Yourself Means Self-Control
  - Self-control removes fear, fuels our power, and provokes love (**II Timothy 1:6-7**)
  - Self-control establishes perspective, ignites, and equips (I Thessalonians 5:5-8, Ephesians 4:11-16)
  - Self-control is hard in adversity, loneliness, and sin (II Timothy 3:1-5, I Corinthians 10:13)
- Loving Yourself Means Self-Love
  - You were made in the image of the Living God (Genesis 1:26–27, Psalm 139:1–18)
  - You were formed for God's plan (Psalm 8:3–5, Luke 12:4–12, Galatians 5:22-23)
- Loving Yourself Means Self-Worth
  - God is proud of our spiritual work (**II Chronicles 19:5–10, Romans 14:11–12**)
  - God's approval is all we should seek (II Corinthians 10:12–18, II Timothy 2:15)

### III. Loving Your Enemies Takes Action

- Love Anyone Who Curses You (Matthew 5:9-12, Luke 6:28, Romans 12:14)
- Love Anyone Who Hates You (Matthew 5:13-16 , Luke 6:27, John 15:18-19)
- Love Anyone Who Angers You (Matthew 5:21-24, Matthew 18:15-17, Galatians 6:1-2)
- Love Anyone Who Uses You (Matthew 5:38-41, Matthew 27:27-30, Galatians 6:10)
- Love Anyone Who Persecutes You (Matthew 5:43-48, Acts 8-9 , I Timothy 1:13-16)

<u>Conclusion</u>: We need to have an active faith! Every facet of our life should be impacted by our faith in God, our hope for the second coming of Jesus Christ, and our comfort in the Holy Spirit. Do you love God relationally, personally and socially? Are you putting that love into action? Are you rooted in Christ?
